

We are in Afghanistan to have a look at our projects and visit orphaned families. The story of 60-year-old Aunt Voguma, to whom we gave a goat last year, sums up very well what can become of small acts of kindness: "My son died in a traffic accident last year. I live with my three grandchildren and my daughter-in-law. Before the goats came, we lived off the help of our neighbors and relatives. Now I have three goats, and one of them is pregnant. Soon we will have four goats. We drink the goats' milk, and my grandchildren like it very much. I sell some of it at the market. From what we earn, we buy food. My greatest aspiration is to have even more goats. If I have more goats, I can easily pay for my grandchildren's school fees. My eldest granddaughter, Cemile, was the most happy about the goats. She used to help me a lot with the housework, but now she forgets all about me when she plays with the goats."

## My name is Rizkina. I live in Aceh, Indonesia. I was only three years old when my father died, and I became an orphan. Life after my father was very difficult. You can be sure that my mother had the hardest time. She tried very hard to make sure that we had a good life. At the age of six. I entered ele-

At the age of six, I entered elementary school, which I finished successfully. When my mother noticed my success and enthusiasm, she wished to enroll me in a better school. However, due to financial constraints, we were unable to afford it, and it left us feeling desperate. In 2010, I learned that there was an orphanage for girls in a place far from our home. That's how I got to know IHH.

When I came to the orphanage, I was still in secondary school. I was aware that I had to work hard to have a good future. After graduating from secondary school, I gained admission to one of the best high schools in Aceh with my friend Wasmiani. Initially, high school posed some challenges for me, but through perseverance and hard work, I managed to overcome them and consistently excel in my studies. The

sisters in the orphanage where I lived played a big part in this. They always supported me.

After graduating from high school, I enrolled in the business faculty of a state university in Aceh. I was very happy about that. During my studies, I always tried to support my younger and older sisters at the orphanage and make their work easier.

At the end of four years, in 2020, I graduated from university with a very good grade. I could do any profession I wanted and have better opportunities. But I decided to be a big sister to orphans and started working at IHH's orphanage.

I have worked hard all my life to achieve something. Now I will strive to be an exemplary big sister for orphans and support dozens of orphans in the future. I would like to thank my brothers, sisters and IHH in Türkiye for their support. I will continue to prove myself worthy of them and stand by orphans throughout my life.







Project sponsorship includes the promotion of project-related activities such as the construction or renovation of orphanages, houses, schools, the provision of teaching materials or health services. Furthermore, we extend our support to orphan families by facilitating income-generating ventures, which include vocational training courses, store openings, fishing boats, and provision of livestock. Through the generous aid of philanthropic project sponsors, we can undertake the establishment of an orphanage. These contributions enable us to construct vital facilities within the orphanage, such as the library, dormitory, and kitchen, or alternatively, they can help cover the annual expenses of any one of our 42 orphanages spread across 12 countries.

## They call me mom



"We visited the mothers of orphaned children in Niger. One of these mothers was Sister Selamu, to whom we gave a sewing machine three years ago. She told us how her life has changed with the sewing machine: "My husband died of an illness five years ago. I was left alone with my three children. The household had an abundance of needs that required my immediate attention. I had to ask my siblings for money. IHH gave me a sewing machine in 2018. Now I can meet the needs of my house and children by myself. In three years, my business has grown and I have bought four more sewing machines. I teach sewing and embroidery to other mothers of orphaned children like me and to students. We make the orders I receive together. The students call me mom because I give them work. My business had improved, but in the meantime my sister passed away. I took one of my nieces who now lives with me. Thanks to the sewing machine, I can also take care of my sister's child."

One of them is Firdevs, who is in her final year of secondary school.

Firdevs' biggest dream for the near future is to study at an İmam Hatip high school in Türkiye. For that, she continues to study and prepare for her exams. What she has seen and learned about Türkiye in her Turkish classes excites her. And that's why she wants to study in Türkiye. Her favorite subject is English. She tries to learn it and speak it well. She wants to be a dentist when she grows up.

They are very happy that volunteers from Türkiye visit them several times a year. "The big sisters from Türkiye take us to the sea, have picnics with us, and give us gifts. We play games here and have a lot of fun together. I feel that they love us very much."

When I asked her if she could remember the first day she came to first day I came. It was the first time I was separated from my mother. But I have changed a lot since then. Before, I used to be antisocial. Here I made new friends and gained confidence in many fields. I have become a responsible person. My mother is also very happy about this change. She is happy that I can manage my own affairs, and she thanks IHH. She feels very comfortable when I am here."

Dozens of children like Firdevs are preparing for the future here in a safe and healthy environment. Their needs for food, shelter, and education are covered through donations from philanthropists in Türkiye. The orphanages, where thousands of orphans have been growing up and realizing their dreams for years, continue to be a safe
